

# Observing Religious Ritual in Digital Spaces

### Overview:

Ethnography is the study of people and cultures through observation and participation. In this assignment, you will act as a virtual ethnographer, using *Immersive Religion's* 360-degree videos and virtual tours to study a religious service. Your goal is to observe, take detailed notes, and analyze how ritual, space, and community interact within the tradition you are studying.

# **Learning Objectives:**

By completing this assignment, you will:

- 1. Develop observational and analytical skills essential to religious studies.
- 2. Recognize the significance of ritual, spatial organization, and community in religious practice.
- 3. Reflect on the benefits and limitations of studying religion through immersive digital media.

## Step 1: Choose a Religious Service

Select one of the available immersive resources that document a religious ritual. Examples include:

- **Jummah Prayer** (Islam) A Friday congregational prayer in a mosque.
- **Catholic Mass** (Christianity) A structured service including prayer, scripture, and Eucharist.
- Puja to Durga (Hinduism) A ritual offering and worship service.

### **Step 2: Prepare for Your Observation**

Before watching, do some brief research on the ritual:

- What is its purpose within the tradition?
- Who typically participates, and what roles do they play?
- Are there specific symbols, prayers, or gestures you should watch for?





### **Step 3: Conduct Your Virtual Observation**

Watch the 360-degree video or explore the virtual tour at least twice:

- 1. **First Viewing:** Experience the ritual as a participant might. Note your first impressions.
- 2. **Second Viewing:** Take notes using the following prompts:
  - **Space:** How is the religious space arranged? How does it guide movement and interaction?
  - Ritual Actions: What specific gestures, postures, or practices are being performed?
  - Community & Roles: How do people interact? Are there distinct roles (e.g., clergy, lay participants, musicians)?

# Step 4: Write a 500-Word Reflection

Your reflection should be structured as follows:

## 1. Brief Description (100 words)

- o Identify the ritual you observed and its significance in the tradition.
- Provide a concise description of what took place.

# 2. Key Observations (200 words)

- Describe notable aspects of space, movement, sounds, or interactions.
- How did participants engage with the ritual?

# 3. Analysis & Reflection (200 words)

- How did the space, ritual actions, and community dynamics shape the experience?
- What insights did you gain about the tradition from this immersive experience?
- What aspects of the ritual were difficult to fully grasp through virtual observation?
